Important Information about the Gas Assistance Program



Income eligible, residential heating customers of Unitil may qualify for a lower rate on their natural gas bills from November 1st to April 30th. Please read the eligibility requirements and application procedure described on the reverse side of this flyer. If you do not receive Fuel Assistance funds, you must apply to the company in writing to receive the Low-Income Rate.



Who is Eligible?

How do you apply for the Gas Assistance Program?

Fuel Assistance recipients do not need to apply. You will automatically be enrolled in the program when we are notified about your fuel assistance benefit.
