






IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR OUR LIFE SUPPORT CUSTOMERS

As part of our storm or scheduled outage planning. Unitil makes special efforts to send advance notification to help you prepare for power outages.



For the safety of our crews, as well as your own and other motorists, please drive slowly when you see any utility work warning signs, flashing lights from bucket trucks, or workers on or near roadways. Consider the following tips as you approach such areas:

- Follow the directions given by warning signs, traffic flaggers or law enforcement.
- Reduce speed as you approach and travel through a work area.
- Respect and give distance to traffic cones and other control devices. Often, these are the only items standing between our crews and your vehicle.
- Do not allow distractions to take your eyes off the roadway as you travel through the work area.

SAFETY FIRST

CAN YOU RECOGNIZE A NATURAL GAS LEAK?

Gas leaks are rare, but when they do occur, it's important to know how to spot the signs and act in a safe manner:



Watch for debris or fire blowing up from the ground, water bubbling in a wet area, or otherwise healthy vegetation dying in one spot.



You may hear a hissing sound, as the gas is pressurized and a break in the line causes it to move very swiftly. You may also hear an alarm from a residential methane detector. These devices work like a smoke detector, using an internal sensor that measures and monitors the concentration of methane in the air. There are a range of detectors available on the market. We recommend that whatever you purchase is UL rated (UL 1484).



You may smell rotten eggs, caused by an odorant that is added to gas to make leaks more detectable.

If you suspect a gas leak, immediately leave the area or building. When at a safe distance, call 9-1-1. Emergency responders and the utility company will inspect and secure the area.
