### NOTICE OF FILING AND REQUEST FOR COMMENTS

D.P.U. 17-24

March 8, 2017

Petition of Fitchburg Gas and Electric Light Company, d/b/a Unitil, for approval of its Revenue Decoupling Adjustment Factors for the 2017 Off-Peak Period, May 1, 2017, through October 31, 2017.

On January 30, 2017, Fitchburg Gas and Electric Light Company, d/b/a Unitil (“Company”) filed a petition with the Department of Public Utilities (“Department”) for approval of its gas division’s revenue decoupling adjustment factors (“RDAFs”), for effect May 1, 2017. This filing was made pursuant to Fitchburg Gas and Electric Light Company, D.P.U. 15-80/15-81 (2016) and the Company’s revenue decoupling adjustment clause (“RDAC”) tariff, M.D.P.U. No. 189. The RDAC allows the Company to modify, on an annual basis, its base distribution rates as a result of changes in customer use, in order to promote the efficient deployment of demand resources. D.P.U. 15-80/15-81, at 25. The Department has docketed this petition as D.P.U. 17-24.

The Company proposes RDAF credits of \$0.0110 per therm for the residential non-heating and heating class; \$0.0073 per therm for the high winter use general service class; \$0.0022 per therm for the low winter use general service class, effective May 1, 2017 through October 31, 2017. As a result of the changes to the RDAF, the average residential heating customer using 25 therms per month during the off-peak period will experience a bill decrease of \$2.73 or 5.17 percent from the previously effective off-peak RDAFs. Unitil states that the average monthly bill impact for all customers, will range between a decrease of 0.47 percent and 7.41 percent depending on rate class and use.
